<u>Isabella Candee Foundation</u> Julie Ivers, Chairman <u>djivers3@gmail.com</u>

The Isabella Candee Foundation was established in 1987 to create an investment structure from which interest can be withdrawn and placed in the general fund to offset the budget.

Contributions of any amount are welcome and are deductible for income tax purposes. One may contribute "in honor of", "in memory of", "in recognition of", or by making a personal contribution.

Isabella Candee served as the first president of GFWC Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs 1894-1896. At that time, she was a charter member of the Cairo Woman's Club and Library Association.

Isabella Shepard Laning was born in Pennsylvania in 1846 and moved to Illinois when she was 9. She lived in La Salle and attended Monticello and Rockford seminaries. She married Henry Hinsdale Candee of Cairo in 1868. She was a popular woman, known for her work in 1893 on the Woman's Board of Illinois for the Columbian Exposition. She was one of only five lady managers. She died in Chicago in 1931 and is buried there. Isabella Candee knew Illinois from the north to the south.

We will be celebrating the 125th Anniversary of our state federation in October, 2019. This club year would be a great time to "connect to the past and reach out to the future" by making a contribution to this foundation.

I would challenge each club to donate \$1.25/member in memory of Isabella Candee for the lasting legacy she created for Illinois! All donations will be recognized at the State Convention.

GFWC MEMBER WRITING CONTESTS - POETRY AND SHORT STORY

Rules

- Author must be dues-paying member of an active GFWC club.
- Entries must be typed, double-spaced, printed on one side only, with minimum margins of one-inch on all four sides, on 8.5 x 11-inch paper.
- Entries must be written during the contest year (January 1-December 31).
- Entries must have the following in the top right hand corner of each page:
 - o Author's name, e-mail address, mailing address and phone number
 - o Name of the author's GFWC Club, District and State Federation
 - o Category (Short Story or Poetry) and Title of Manuscript
- Author must be an amateur; earnings from writing may not exceed \$500 annually.
- Entries may not have been published prior to the competition and must be original works by the author.
- A signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver <u>must</u> be included with each submission.
- One entry per member per category.
- Short stories are limited to 2,000 words.
- Poetry entries can be any style, with a minimum length of eight lines and a maximum of 50 lines.
- Entry in English. (Optional)

Please NOTE

- Manuscripts will <u>not</u> be returned. Authors should keep a copy.
- By submitting an entry to GFWC, author is providing GFWC with royalty-free perpetual license to
 use, reproduce, post, display, create derivative works, sell, license the work in any media known or
 later invented without limitation, for commercial or non-commercial purposes.

• <u>State</u> – <u>Member entries are to be submitted to the State Arts Chairman by **February 1.** She will select a 1st Place winner statewide for each contest. Submit entries to:</u>

The first place poem and excerpts of the top short story will be printed in the GFWC Annual Awards Booklet and in the September + October issue of *GFWC Clubwoman Magazine*.

GFWC ILLINOIS PAINTING CONTEST

Rules

- Artist must be a GFWC Illinois member in good standing with her local Club.
- The contest is open to amateur artists only. Any person who earns more than 1/3 of their yearly net income from their artistic endeavors will be considered professional and not eligible.
- Entries must be no larger than 14" x 18" (including matting) and no smaller than 10" x 12".
- Entries on materials other than canvas must be matted.
- NO GLASS OR FRAMES
- Pastels should be sprayed with a fixative.
- All paintings must be original. Subject matter is choice of artist.
- Entries must have the following on a card in the top right hand corn on back of the painting:
 - o Name, e-mail address, mailing address, phone number
 - o Media
 - o Sponsoring Club and District Number
- A completed and signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver <u>must</u> be submitted with each entry.

Please NOTE

- All entries to be judged must be brought to GFWC Illinois Convention on the first day and delivered to the Arts and Crafts Room.
- All entries must be picked up on the last day of Convention.

Recognition

- <u>District</u> Recognition at the District level will be at the discretion of the District.
- <u>State</u> Certificates and ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. All entries will be on display in the Arts and Crafts Room at GFWC Illinois Convention.

GFWC PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

GFWC offers three opportunities to participate in the Photography Contest.

A. THE WORLD IN PICTURES captures the beauty of the world and people around us in three categories:

Living Things - adults, animals, children, domestic birds, fish, flowers, insects, reptiles, wildlife

Scenes - city, landscapes, rural, skies, sunrise, sunset, waterscapes, weather

<u>Still Life</u> – abstract (any assemblage of objects either in an arranged or natural setting), buildings, monuments

- **B. GFWC VOLUNTEERS IN ACTION** provides members with the opportunity to demonstrate their volunteer activities through photography.
- **C. A YEAR IN PICTURES**-also known as the GFWC Calendar Contest-features photographs depicting the twelve months of the year, providing members the opportunity to showcase their talents while supporting GFWC through the fundraising calendar.

Rules-The following rules apply to all three photography contests:

- All photographers must be dues paying members of an active GFWC club.
- Photos must be taken during the contest year (January 1st to December 31st).
- Contestant must be an amateur; photography earnings may not exceed \$500 annually.
- Photographs must be the original work of the member submitting the photo.
- Each photo must have a label affixed to its back with the following info:
 - Contest name
 - o Photographer's name, e-mail address, mailing address, phone number
 - Name and State of sponsoring club
 - o Title and brief caption giving location, date and other notes about the photo
 - o Arrow indicating top of photo
- Each submission must be an 8x10 inch print. Electronic submissions will not be considered, high resolution digital copies of the submission is encouraged.
- Photos will be mounted on a rigid 8x10 inch mount board and total thickness may not exceed 3/8 inch.

- Do not submit photos with mattes or frames, nor hangers on the back.
- Each submission <u>must</u> include a signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver.
- Photos may be taken using film or digital cameras
- Photos submitted to GFWC will not be returned
- Judges look for creativity and quality of photograph

<u>Disclaimer-By</u> submitting your photographs to GFWC for the GFWC Photography Contests on the national level, you are providing GFWC with a royalty-free perpetual license to use, reproduce, post, display, create derivative works, sell, license or sub-license the work in any media now known or later invented without limitation for commercial or non-commercial purposes.

The World in Pictures Photography Contest Rules

- There are two classes per category
 Black and White
 Color
- Photos may be vertical/portrait or horizontal/landscape.
- Clubs submit photos directly to their State Federation by March 1.
- Images may be submitted to multiple contests, but separate photos must be entered each time.
- All photographers must be dues paying members of an active GFWC club.
- Contestants must be an amateur photographer- earnings from photography may not exceed \$500 annually.

<u>Deadline</u>-Send entries to: State Arts Chairman by March 1.

Recognition-There are 1st, 2nd, 3rd place winners nationally for each category in both black and white and color. In the GFWC Member Division, awards are as follows: 1st Place - \$100; 2nd Place - \$75 and 3rd Place - \$50. Photos not sent to GFWC will be displayed at GFWC Illinois State Convention and may be picked up there. State-Certificates and ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded at GFWC Illinois State Convention.

- Judges look at overall creativity of subject and quality of photograph.
